May 3 Avery Fromet “INDUSTRIAL TITANS, ROBBER BARONS AND SCALAWAGS OF THE LATE 19TH CENTURY”

The latter half of the 19th century saw unprecedented industrial growth in the United States. This growth was led by men who revolutionized the railroad, iron and steel industry and amassed huge fortunes in the process. The lack of labor and financial regulation allowed these men to consolidate their holdings, monopolizing these industries unfettered by government intrusion. In this brief seminar we will discuss four of these titans of industry, Cornelius Vanderbilt, Jay Gould, Andrew Carnegie and JP Morgan.
