

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS Spring 2024

ALTERNATIVE AMERICAN RELIGIONS / Hugh Burtner, Ph.D.

In this course we will look at the origins, beliefs and influence of the Quakers, Mormons, Christian Scientists, Seventh-Day Adventists, Jehovah's Witnesses, and the Assemblies of God. Our study will help us better understand parts of our rich and varied American religious landscape.

BIRDING IN NORTHEAST OHIO – IT'S FOR EVERYONE / Marty Cohen, Ph.D.

Why birding? Because it's fun. There are over 200 different kinds of birds in Northeast Ohio that anyone can see with a little practice and help from readily available resources. We will discuss birding for beginner to expert and learn about the local hotspots to see birds and enjoy nature. Lots of bird photos too. (A version of this course was given in 2019.)

CIVIL WAR STORIES / Steven Schecter, M.A.

A look at what you did not learn in high school and correcting some of the lies that were taught. This class highlights interesting personalities, from women spies to comparing Lincoln and Jefferson Davis. The North, based on population and industry, should have easily won the war within two years. We will explore why this did not happen.

COMMON MYTHS IN HUMAN BEHAVIOR / Theodore Chandler, Ph.D.

About a dozen common myths in human behavior (such as practice, genetics, empathy) will be explored to illustrate the negative consequences of failing to address their impact. A list of myths will be distributed during the first session.

FREE WILL AND MORAL RESPONSIBILITIES / Theodore Smith, B.S.

Philosophers, Theologians and even Physicists have grappled with the idea of free will. Some conclude we have it, but don't use it very well. Others deny its existence at all. If we do have it, what's the best use of it? Stephen Hawking, Richard Muller and Gerald Schroeder all sought an answer through science. Aristotle, Augustine, Thomas Aquinas, Spinoza and Immanuel Kant have all weighed in on the subject as well. Let's explore and discuss their conclusions.

iPHONE CAMERA BASICS...THE VERY BASICS / Gurmukh Bhatia, B.S.

For those of you using an Apple iPhone, in this class we will show you the basic controls of your phone's camera app. Aside from talking about how to take a picture, we will talk about live photos, zoom, taking panoramic photos, adjusting exposure and taking video. INTRODUCTION TO TAI CHI AND QIGONG / Gary A. Harris, BSEE,

This is an 8-Step Yang Style Tai Chi form that will introduce students to several basic movements that are in the 24-Step Yang Style form. We will also play several different Qigong exercises. Tai Chi is a form of Qigong. Qigong exercises help to gather and move energy throughout the body. We will also do some basic exercises to help with balance.

JEFFERSON'S BIBLE / Theodore Smith, B.S.

Of all his accomplishments, Thomas Jefferson was most proud of Self-Governance, Freedom of Religion and Education. He wanted a solid philosophy to guide both the people and his fledgling nation and their elected representatives. Jefferson literally took a razor blade to several copies of the Bible, cutting and pasting the teachings of Jesus onto blank pages. The result is "The Life and Morals of Jesus of Nazareth." We will explore his life and times, what he put in and left out, and why.
